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About the Teacher:

Venerable U Ukkansa



Born in 1971 in Kyaikhto, Ashin Ukkansa ordained as a novice monk (samanera) at a monastery in Kyaikhto in 1988. He received the higher ordination as a bhikkhu on 23 October 1990 at Kemāsīvam Pariyatti School in Kyaikhto, where he studied Buddhist Pali Studies. He passed the "Pathama Gyi" examinations in 1998.

From 1998 to 2003, Ashin Ukkansa was a teacher of Pali language at Sasana Lyin Yaung Kyi Pariyatti School, at Pago.

Ashin Ukkansa went to Pa-Auk Forest Monastery in May 2003, and learned and practiced Samatha & Vipassana meditation under the Abbot, the most Venerable Pa-Auk Tawya Sayadaw Bhaddanta Acinna.

Since December 2006, Ashin Ukkansa has been appointed a Kammathanacariya (Meditation Teacher) at Pa-Auk Forest Monastery, Mawlamyine.

Ashin Ukkansa has assumed his duties as the Resident Teacher of PAMC in April 2008, and he has conducted several retreats in Singapore and taught various Dhamma courses since then.



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About the Teacher:

Venerable U Mahinda



Born in 1971, Bhante hails from China; he is Meditation Teacher (Kammatthanacariya) at Pa-Auk Forest Monastery ("Pa-Auk"), Mawlamyine, Myanmar.

Ordained in July 2002 at Pa-Auk Forest Monastery with the most Venerable Pa-Auk Tawya Sayadaw Bhaddanta Acinna ("Ven Pa-Auk Sayadaw") as preceptor, he has practised Samatha & Vipassana meditation under the instructions of Ven Pa-Auk Sayadaw. Commencing May 2004, he assisted the Sayadaw as translator during interviews and helped in tutoring yogis. In March 2006, Bhante was authorised by Ven Pa-Auk Sayadaw to teach meditation and has been conducting meditation interviews for monastics and lay yogis at Pa-Auk since then.

Ven U Mahinda has conducted 5 well-received meditation retreats in July 2007, March 2008, November 2008 and February 2009 and June 2009 in Singapore; he has also taught the Abhidhamma Part 1 in February 2008 at Cheng Beng Buddhist Society, Abhidhamma Part 2 in November 2008 and Part 3 in January 2009 at Pa-Auk Meditation Centre, Singapore.

In addition to Myanmar and Singapore, Bhante has also given Dhamma talks and taught meditation retreats in Malaysia, Taiwan and China.
